Hawaii Condo Insurance Crisis

In the February DA KINE, we reported on the significant increase in our property insurance policy. This trend was not unique to our property.



Condo associations throughout Hawaii have been faced with similar, and in some cases, much more extreme increases. Some associations are considering the option to self-insure.

The Hawaii State Legislature is taking action to stabilize property insurance. They have introduced HB2686 HD1 SD1.

The issues are complex and beyond the scope of this newsletter to report on. Fortunately, we have two links for you to follow to get up to speed on the issues.

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The first link will take you to a video replay of a PBS Hawaii Television Show featuring a panel of experts. One of the panelists is our Insurance Representative, Sue Savio. We urge you to take the time to view this show.

**DIS 'N 'DAT – Why do Roosters Crow



We grew up in the city. There were no roosters or chickens around. We knew nothing about them till we came to Hawaii where they are everywhere! We began to wonder why Roosters crow, so

we decided to search for answers.

We were surprised to learn that there has been scientific research on this topic.

So, we challenge you. Before reading this article, write down Your answer to the following questions:

- 1. When do Roosters Crow?
- 2. Why do Roosters Crow?
- 3. Do All Roosters Crow?

Then compare your answers to the findings of the Chicken Scientists.

Answer to when Roosters Crow is whenever they want to. They tend to start crowing about two hours before sunrise. Scientists believe they have an internal clock that tells them when it is time to start crowing.

But they will also crow at anytime during the day or night or night when the urge strikes them. It seems there are triggers that cause them to crow. These triggers can occur at any time of the day.

Next question is why they crow (the triggers).

It seems they crow back and forth to establish their territory and to call their flock together.

You will hear a rooster crow nearby and then hear other roosters answer in the distance. Scientists believe that they can avoid fights by letting each other know where their territory is.

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They also crow to scare off intruders and to establish their dominance over other roosters in the flock.

It appears that roosters crow to attract the ladies (hens).

They will crow after mating, maybe to boast to their lesser peers.





Some roosters express pride by crowing after a hen lays an egg.

Maybe Roosters are not that much different from us humans in those cases!

Finally, the answer to the question, do all roosters crow?

Well.....Yes and then again No. While all roosters can crow, there are strict rules on when they can and when they cannot.



You have head of the term "pecking order". That certainly exists with roosters. The dominant rooster crows first. He will then be followed by

those roosters beneath him, lower down in the "pecking order."

Even though the lesser roosters may have their internal clocks telling them it is time to start crowing, they will wait for the head rooster to kick it all off.

They also seem to crow in order of dominance or place in the rooster hierarchy. The scientists do not elaborate on the penalty for crowing out of order, but it seems a good pecking might be part of price they pay.
